SAMPLE COURSE

ART REMIX

This course combines both traditional and computer-based techniques to create an image. It is a studio-based exploration of image-capture devices and traditional art media in art and society. The course will expose you to a variety of art making experiences that are focused on combining traditional media, such as painting, sculpture, printmaking, and photography, with new media forms, to create hybrid projects to stretch the bounds of your art practice.

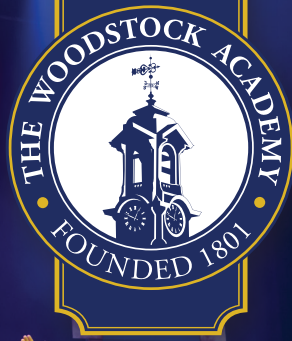

SAMPLE COURSE

History of Rock and Other American Music

In this course you will get a comprehensive overview of music produced over the last 100 years. You will begin with the origins of American music in ragtime, jazz, and Broadway and then explore the major musical genres that have emerged since. Learn to evaluate music and the execution of performance and explore the relationship between music and culture.

Performing Arts

The renovated Center for the Arts auditorium allows more than 1,000 people to watch and support student theater and musical productions. The Woodstock Academy regularly brings professional performers to the Center for the Arts for students and the community to enjoy.

Recent theater productions include *Shrek the Musical*, *Legally Blonde*, *Cinderella*, *Romeo and Juliet*, *Grease*, Neil Simon's *Rumors*, and student theater projects.



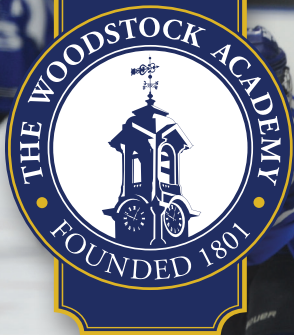
